Workshop Options 11:10

1) Intergenerational Worship

Sister Michelle Collins, Presenter

Worship is at the center of our shared life together. How can this essential part of church engage and include people of all ages? In the words of the familiar hymn, how can worship continue to 'tell the old, old story, of Jesus and his love' in a way that speaks to all generations? This workshop will offer some framework, some best practices, and some guiding principles for crafting dynamic worship that connects with all ages.

Sister Michelle Collins is an ELCA Deacon and a member of the ELCA Deaconess Community. She serves the Florida-Bahamas Synod on synod staff as the Director of Communication and Discipleship. Before serving on synod staff, Sr. Michelle worked in faith formation ministry, helping to strengthen and equip congregations to be intentional, intergenerational communities invested in active, lifelong faith formation. Sr. Michelle graduated from Luther Seminary in 2007, and was consecrated as a Deaconess in 2011.

2) Reflections on Beginning an Older Adult Ministry in 2019 Pat Baker, Presenter

This workshop will look at the strategies used leading up to starting an older adult ministry in 2019. She'll talk about the differences and similarities over the decades in older adult ministry. She hopes to learn from others who are involved in older adult ministry today so come to this workshop willing to share and discuss ideas for ministry to and for older adults and family caregivers.

Pat Baker's career in the field of aging spans over 45 years in both the private and public sector. She recently retired as the Director of Health and Human Services/Senior Services for Gwinnett County, GA. In early 2019 she took a position at St. Andrews Presbyterian Church in Tucker, GA where she is the Director of Older Adult and Caregiver Ministries. Pat has been involved with POAMN since its inception and is now the Vice President. One of her passions is working with family caregivers and she currently facilitates three caregiver support groups. She laughingly says that she has failed at retirement!!

3) How Can You Become Dementia Friendly? Debbie Selsavage, Presenter

This workshop is about understanding the characteristics and symptoms that a person living with dementia may experience. How is will appear as a behavior, how you can better interact with them, how to keep both the caregiver and the person living with dementia social and active as long as possible. This workshop is interactive and Q&A is encouraged. We do role play to demonstrate the most effective approach, touch, and voice in caring for a person with dementia.

Debbie Selsavage is a Certified Dementia Practitioner, Alzheimer's Family Organization Board of Directors President, a columnist for the Citrus County Chronicle. She is a Certified Independent Trainer in Teepa Snow's Positive Approach to Care (PAC) and the founder of her own company, Coping with Dementia LLC.

4) Grandparenting for Faith: Mine, Yours, and Ours Rev Michael Smith, Presenter

This presentation speaks directly into God's ordained spiritual activity which has been prepared for the third season of our lives. Cultural trends in the U.S. sideline older adults while God's word encourages, equips and engages us to prepare future generations. God blesses us through grandchildren, and we can bless them with our time, talents, and spiritual faith.

Rev. Michael Smith serves as Associate Pastor at North Lake Presbyterian Church in Lady Lake, Florida overseeing all of the church's discipleship ministries. His heart is to help people of all ages grow closer in their personal relationship with God through intercessory prayer, Bible study and spiritual retreats. His personal discipleship includes attending the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary to earn a Doctor of Ministry in, "Forming Communities: Faith, Families, and the Future of Ministry."

5) Spirituality of Aging

Rev Bill Cooley, Presenter

The class will acknowledge that aging is a time of losses, including our work identities, also of transitions and new beginnings; it is also our movement from control and independence toward dependence and finally to one's own death. These changes will challenge our identities and our faith. The class will raise questions for participants like wondering about God's presence in our losses and considering beliefs and devotional practices that are helpful or not in our journey through the last third of life. It will also offer handouts that can help continue the explorations of whom we are and offer several prayer practices that may help deepen our relationship with God after the workshop.

Bill Cooley is honorably retired after serving 29 years as a pastor in the Presbyterian Church. He has been a member of POAMN since 2004, where he developed an interest in older adult spirituality. He earned a certificate in older adult ministry through POAMN. He is a Spiritual Director and a retreat leader, engaging older adults in acknowledging their losses and changes and exploring their spiritual questions.
