

Disaster Preparedness Tips

Hurricane Season Begins June 1st!



- 1. Set up a list of key staff members and church leaders and update annually: Name, position, phone numbers and e-mails.
- 2. Set up a list of utilities and key contractors/vendors with name, address, phone, fax, website, and church rep's name, phone and e-mail. Include off-hours emergency contact information.
- 3. In-church resources-members who are:
 - A. Local fire department member
 - B. Local EMS member
 - C. Local law enforcement
 - D. Licensed contractor, electrician, plumber, IT, well driller (depending on area), etc.
 - E. Someone good at PowerPoint, pdf Printer, Word, Excel and other computer programs

4. Local Resources:

- A. Fire Department
- B. Law Enforcement
- C. EMS
- D. Insurance carrier and its Risk Management Department to do a property inspection or provide recommendations for the property and buildings
- E. Look around church property during the day, at night and during a heavy rain: What do you see that is unsafe, dangerous, in need of repair, taken down and replaced, etc.
- F. Remember: The majority of injuries in home, work, and other places (church) are from Slips, Trips and Falls
- G. Have someone prepare a plan of the church property and floorplan as a base map for all kinds of information: emergency exit plans, location of all fire extinguishers, first aid kits, AED, emergency equipment, etc., the location of all utilities and shutoffs, phone, etc.
- H. List of all local media primarily serving community: Radio, TV, websites, mobile apps
