Volunteers are foundation members, church members and other community members provide support with picking up any food donations, sorting the food and distributing the food.

In addition, a group of women prepare 200+ hot breakfasts that are served to food recipients as they receive their food boxes. The funds will allow the pantry to provide additional foods that are not donated to serve all who come.

Endorsement from Rev. Holly Dillon Inglis, Ministry and Mission Coordinator

Ft. Caroline Presbyterian Church is one of ten Matthew 25 congregations in the Presbytery of St. Augustine. Among the 54 churches in the presbytery, Ft. Caroline is one of the smaller churches, with 54 members. While their membership and worship attendance numbers may be small, their commitment and dedication to the work of justice and mercy is huge. Through their partnership with the <u>Jim Dotson Foundation</u>, this congregation has found new vitality and new purpose in serving the needs of their community. Their growing awareness of the poverty in the greater Arlington area has led them to ask larger, systemic questions, to look beyond hunger to the root causes of poverty. Recently, during one of their monthly food distribution events, they were approached by several Ukrainian refugee families who needed not only food, but basic household and personal supplies. The pastor sent the following message to the congregation:

Subject: WE NEED YOUR HELP

As you know we feed hundreds of folks on Saturday mornings in our parking lot but today we had 6 families from Ukraine show up not only needing food but loads of other items. There is a baby boy 3 months old who was born just before Russia attacked them, so he needs size 2 diapers and clothing. There is an 8-year-old boy and a 10 year old girl both needing clothing. Women needing shirts medium, men a man needing shirts large. They need shampoo for the baby and the family. They need at least one bed and a bedside table. Please bring all to the church.

A recent post on the Matthew 25 Facebook page from Ft. Caroline sums up this congregation: "Doing Unto Others Can't Be Practiced Often Enough." This is the spirit of Matthew 25 – the Spirit of Christ at work in the greater Arlington community through the Ft. Caroline congregation, supporting neighbors to overcome poverty, to find hope and new life.
